APPOINTMENT OF PROXIES

Please read the following information about the appointment of proxies. If you have any questions please call the General Manager on + 61 2 8284 8406.

Who can I appoint as my proxy?

Voting members of the company may appoint one (1) proxy to vote on their behalf. A proxy does not need to be a member of the company.

How do I vote using a proxy?

To vote using a proxy, you must complete and sign the proxy form.

Your proxy must vote in accordance with your directions on the proxy form, that is either in favour or against the resolutions as indicated on the proxy form.

If you leave the proxy form blank as to the person appointed as proxy or if the person named as your proxy fails to attend the meeting, the chair of the meeting will be appointed proxy for you.

Can my attorney attend the meeting and vote on my behalf?

Yes. Your attorney can attend the meeting and exercise your right to vote provided the terms of the power of attorney are broad enough to allow your attorney to vote for you at meetings of the company. You should check with your solicitor.

When do I need to return my proxy to the company?

You must return your proxy form to the company not less than 48 hours before the time set to hold the meeting. The proxy form must be received by the company in a reasonably legible form by mail or email.

What happens if the meeting is postponed or adjourned and re-convened?

If the meeting is postponed or adjourned, your proxy is entitled to vote at any postponement or adjournment.

Can I revoke my proxy?

Yes. If you want to revoke your appointment of a proxy you must give the company written notice as soon as possible. Otherwise you may be able to achieve the same result by executing a later proxy, directing your proxy to vote in a different way, or by actually attending the meeting and exercising your right to vote.
